

# Notes from the ED (August 2022)



The Council celebrated many things in August, key amongst them being our physical Mission Trip to Indonesia – the first one since 2019. We also saw a number of publications made by the Council and I am very excited to share them with you through the *Notes from the ED* series for the month of August.

# What Went Down in August

We travelled to Indonesia at the beginning of August to hold our **Future of Mobility** forum. This event was a platform which brought together industry experts, thought leaders and policy shapers to discuss the key

trends, challenges and opportunities on mobility and movement-related topics.

As usual, we held our monthly members-only briefing with Bower Group Asia and discussed the political landscape in Malaysia. Among other things, the Council also organised a mental health and team-bonding day this month to energise and rejuvenate ourselves for what is very busy remainder of the year. Speaking of health, we published our paper on *Transforming Diagnostic Access: A Roadmap for ASEAN,* and held a launch webinar alongside, discussing the value and importance of diagnostics in strengthening health systems for all stakeholders within the healthcare continuum. August came back full circle when the Council returned to Indonesia for our Mission Trip at the end of the month. It has been 2 years since our last visit to Indonesia and it was gratifying to hear first-hand how the various Ministries – from the Coordinating Ministry for Economic Affairs, the Ministry of Energy and Mineral Resources, Ministry of Finance, Directorate General of Customs and Excise, Ministries of Trade, Investment, Tourism and Creative Economy, as well as Ministry of Health – are committed to working together with our members to find ways to recover together and recover stronger. During the Mission, the Council did not forget to give back and we visited a local orphanage to send supplies and spread joy to the young ones who will one day grow to lead the country. We commemorated the last day of our meaningful Mission Trip with a networking session jointly organised with **EuroCham Indonesia** where we launched our **8<sup>th</sup> Business Sentiment Survey** and shared the result with the attendees. We look forward to a strong finish to their G20 leadership and await what's in store as the Republic takes on the baton from Cambodia in assuming the ASEAN Chairmanship in 2023.

Before we left, we managed to host one final workshop with CropLife Asia, together with the Canada-ASEAN Business Council, and the US-ASEAN Business Council, to discuss how safe and nutritious food can be delivered across ASEAN even in the midst of food security issues and growing climate crisis.
